Tikey is a small village located 1,500 meters above sea level in the serene hills of Bokod, Philippines. In this village, there is a single building standing against the backdrop of majestic mountains. One building, one classroom, one teacher—it is Tikey Elementary School. Eight students, ranging from 1st through 3rd graders, are studying together in the same classroom. It was Thursday morning. We had evening VBS at the Tikey Church the night before. And we all slept in the upper room of the church. We all woke up early, wanting to meet these children.



Upon our arrival, we were greeted by the teacher and students. The students’ eyes lit up with curiosity and warmth. It was then that we realized the true purpose of our mission trip—not merely to impart knowledge, but to forge bonds of understanding and kindness with Christ’s love.

Caring for Muslim Students During Ramadan

As a Christian school with Muslim students in our midst, it is essential for us, as missionary teachers, to navigate the delicate balance of honoring religious diversity while fostering a sense of belonging and understanding among all students. Particularly during Ramadan, the holiest month in Islam, our approach to caring for our Muslim students takes on added significance. Here at ACA, we have implemented several practices to deepen our connection with our Muslim students during this sacred period.

First and foremost, we respect the fasting observed by our Muslim students. Understanding that Ramadan entails complete abstention from food and water from dawn to dusk, we refrain from questioning or discouraging them in their religious observance. Additionally, we educate our other students of any behavior that may ridicule or undermine our Muslim students during this time.

Prayer is another integral aspect of our approach to supporting our Muslim students during Ramadan. Recognizing the spiritual significance of this month for Muslims, we fervently pray for our students, asking for God's guidance and blessings to be upon them. Furthermore, we pray that during this period of fasting, they may have personal encounters with Jesus Christ, deepening their spiritual journey and understanding of faith.

In a spirit of empathy, some of our teachers choose to fast alongside our Muslim students during Ramadan. Drawing parallels between Ramadan and the Christian season of Lent, which also involves fasting, prayer, and repentance, we find common ground in our spiritual practices. In this year, Ramadan was from March 11 through April 8, while Lent was from February 14

through March 30. I was able to talk to Muslim students while I was fasting about what Jesus went through during the Passion Week, which was from March 25 through 30. This shared experience not only fosters a sense of unity among us but also allows for meaningful conversations and provides wonderful opportunity to engage in deeper conversations about faith, God, Jesus, and the Bible, providing a safe and supportive space for exploration and questioning.

Through these efforts, we strive to build bridges of understanding and compassion, fostering a school environment where all students feel valued, respected, and supported. As missionary teachers, our commitment to nurturing the holistic development of our students extends beyond the confines of classroom instruction, encompassing a genuine desire to connect with each individual on a spiritual and personal level. In embracing the diversity within our school community, we not only enrich our own experiences but also embody the love and acceptance that lie at the core of Jesus' teachings.
